Donate Life Northwest Pilots Donor Registry Campaign

Next time you visit an Oregon DMV, look for this poster. It represents Donate Life Northwest's nine-month [campaign](#) to increase the number of people on the donor registry by targeting drivers who do not have a "D" on their driver's license, permit or ID card. The project goal is to increase to 50% the number of people who add a "D" code when they get their driver's permit or obtain/renew their license or ID card.

Nearing their license renewal date, drivers will receive a one-time mailing reminding them of their opportunity to [sign up](#) as an organ, eye and tissue donor when they visit DMV or [www.donatelifenw.org](#).
