
# Normalization Stores of does

#### **GLORIA LITTLE - A PAIRED DONATION STORY**

After two decades of kidney disease and several years of dialysis, Gloria met Alison. Alison was a white woman who felt strongly that she should become a living kidney donor, specifically to a Black person. Several of Gloria's close friends and family members had been tested as potential living donation matches and had not been compatible matches. As it turned out, Alison wasn't a match either. However, Alison did have an idea that changed everything. She suggested that the two of them join a paired kidney exchange program. This would allow Alison to donate a kidney to a compatible patient in the program, and then Gloria would receive a kidney from a compatible donor in exchange.

It worked! In December 2020, Alison donated a kidney on Gloria's behalf, and in May 2021, Gloria received her lifesaving gift. Now Gloria is healthy enough to spend time with her four grandkids and play basketball with her grandson. In 2022, she even joined a bowling team!





## DONOR REGISTRY

Did you know that Oregon was the first state to adopt Routine Inquiry in 1985? Since then DMV staff have asked if you'd like to be a donor every time you get an official ID or driver's license. In collaboration with the DMV and Donate Life America, Donate Life Northwest runs the Donor Registry for the State of Oregon. Since the database was established in 2007, it has grown to over three million registered donors. Washington's Registry has more than six million donors - combined, the Pacific Northwest is making a difference as leaders in donor registration rates.
