We are thrilled to present Donate Life Northwest's 2023 Threads of Life Quilt. Quilted from 48 handmade squares made or inspired by members of our community, each unique square tells a story.

This year's quilt highlights donor heroes like Kristin Nicole Clovis, who was able to give not only the gifts of life, mobility, and sight, but the gift of joy through her love and friendship. The quilt also features recipients like Mike Weinberg, whose square features a beautifully embroidered heart that reminds us of the complexity of transplants. One of the most unique aspects of donation and transplantation is represented by the Merrill family: Wesley Merrill was the recipient of the first heart transplant in Oregon donated by Bobby Beltran. The 2023 quilt honors his mother Mildred, who lived to be 102 years old. She celebrated her 100th birthday with Balinda and Martha, Bobby's family. Such is the power of donation, connecting families together through heroic stories created by the gifts of life, sight, and health.

In addition to donors and recipients, this year's quilt honors many phenomenal organizations and people that share our mission: member organizations Cascade Life Alliance, Community Tissue Services, and VisionGift; our friends at NW Kidney Kids and the Oregon DMV; transplant hospitals and healthcare professionals; our programs and phenomenal volunteers. We wouldn't be able to do our work without these crucial partners!

As a small child, Garrett liked the color blue and the Number 5. He wanted anything and everything that his dad was building with wood.

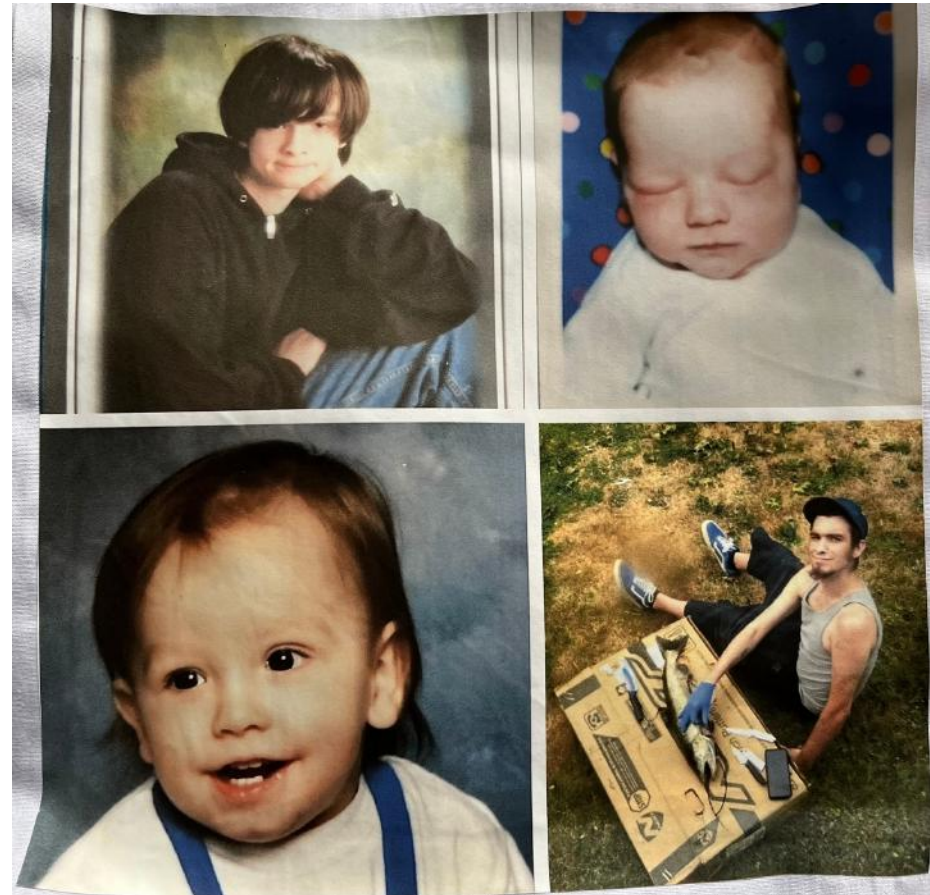
In middle and high school Garrett liked to hang out with his friends at the skate park skateboarding, riding bikes, or playing video games at his friends.

He was a donor who impacted many lives.

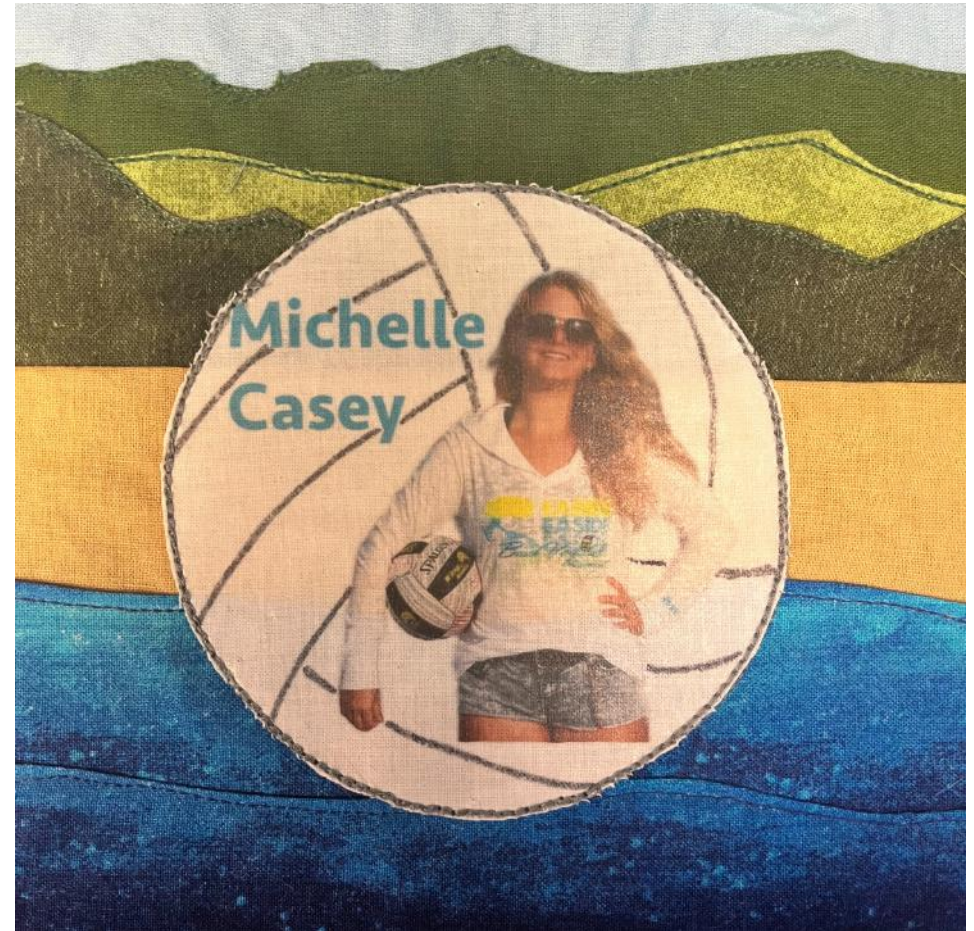

- I have seen a clover every day since Kristin left. Maybe they have always been there, and now I can't get her off my mind so I see them now. They make me smile.

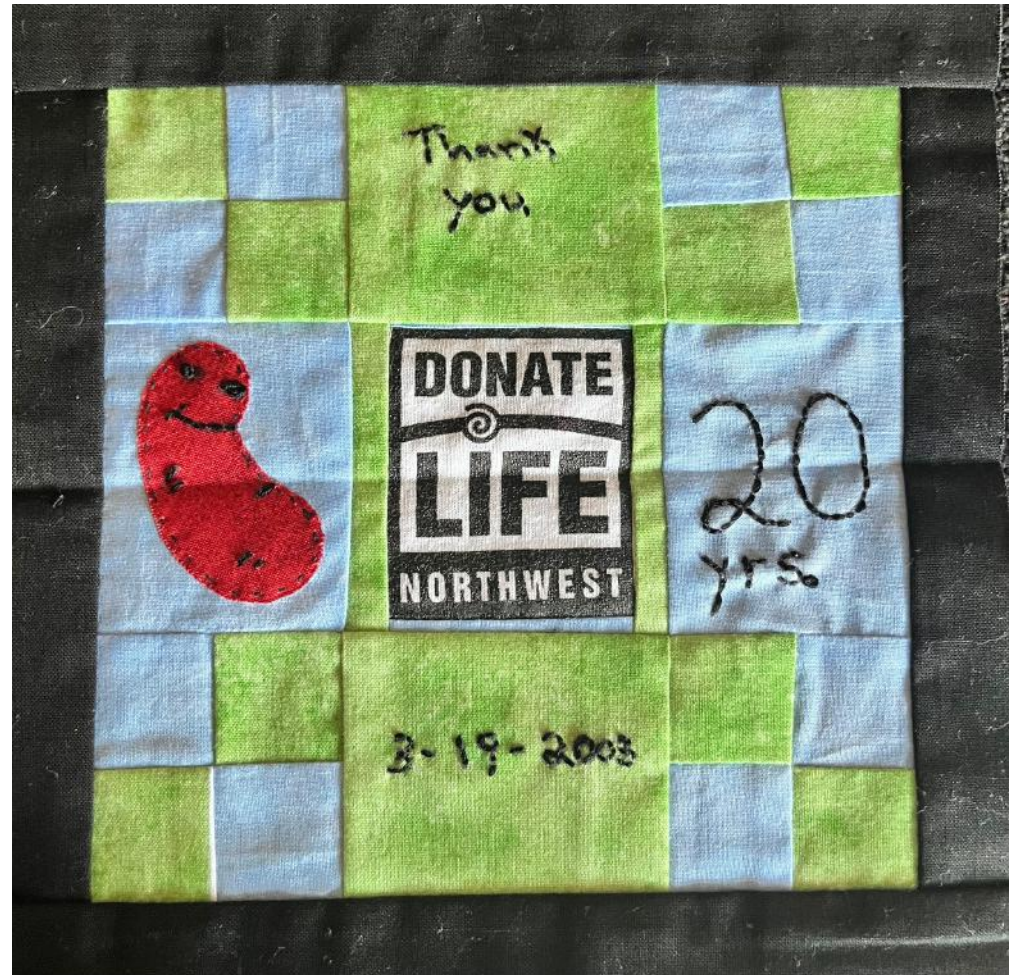

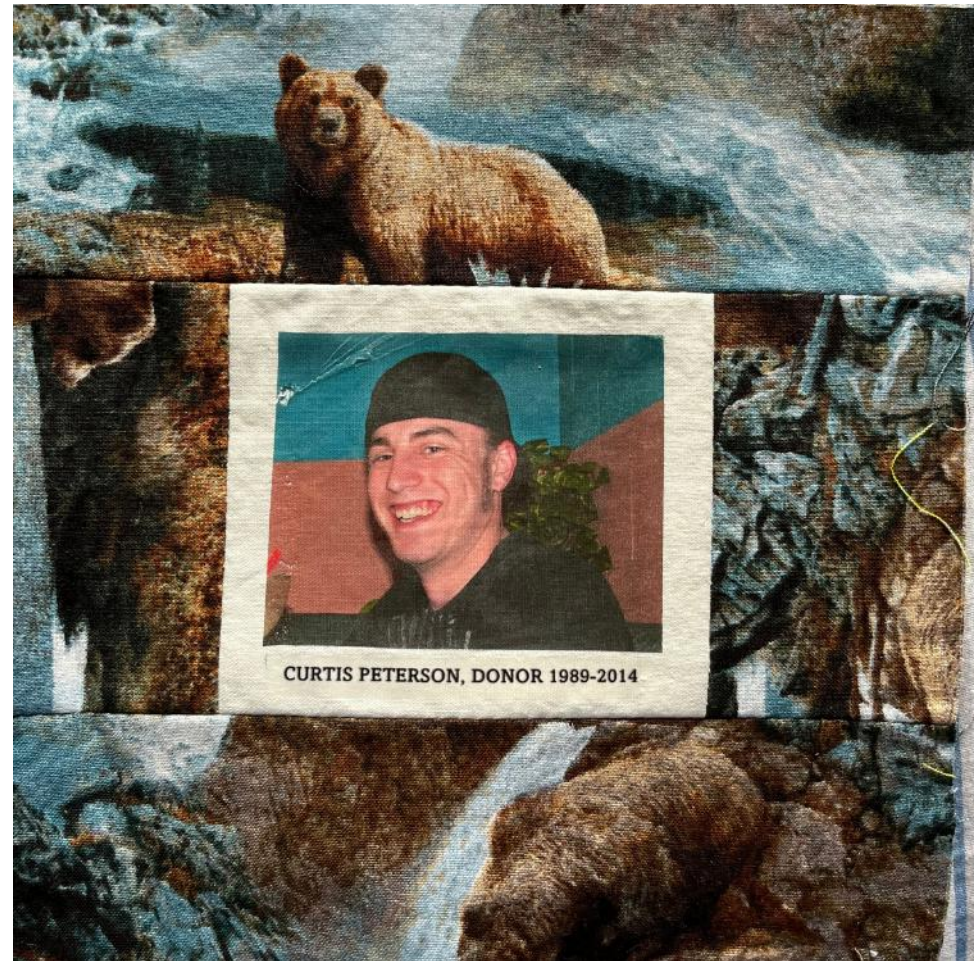

Family and friends were very important to him, and he was happy to help in any way.

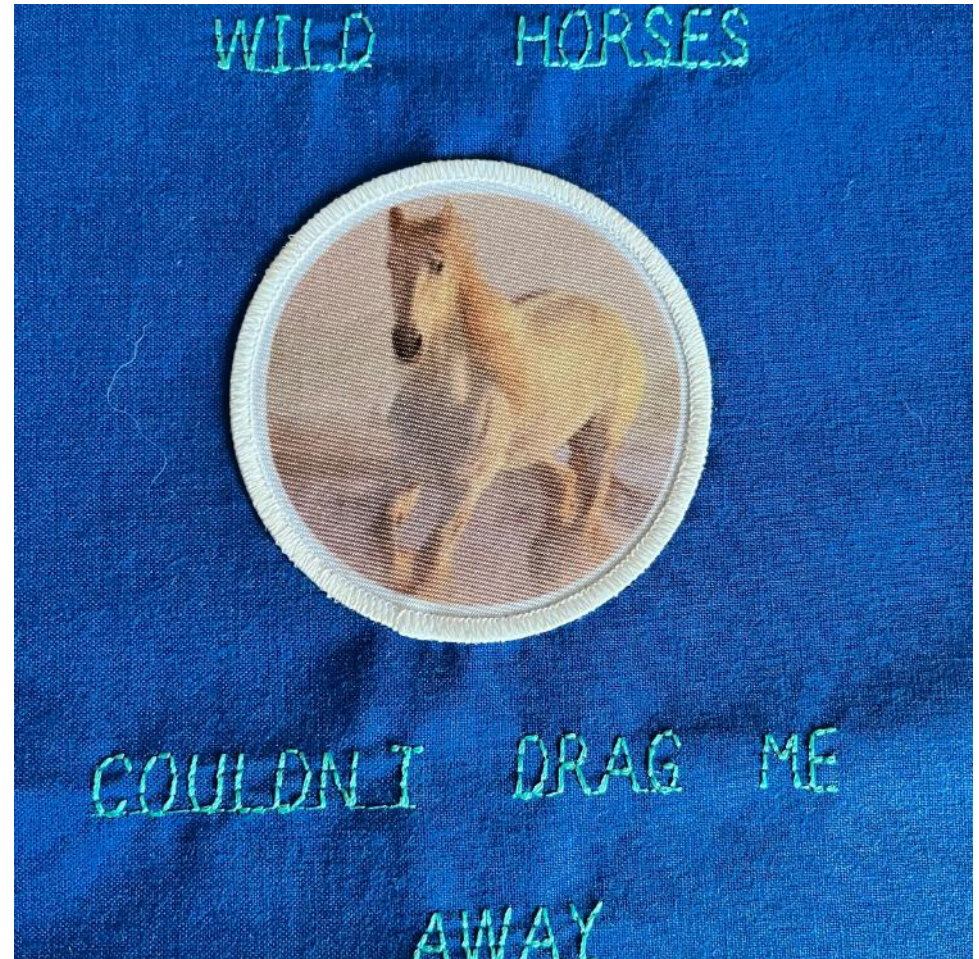
Mark was an avid sports fan. He loved baseball, and the Dodgers were his favorite team.

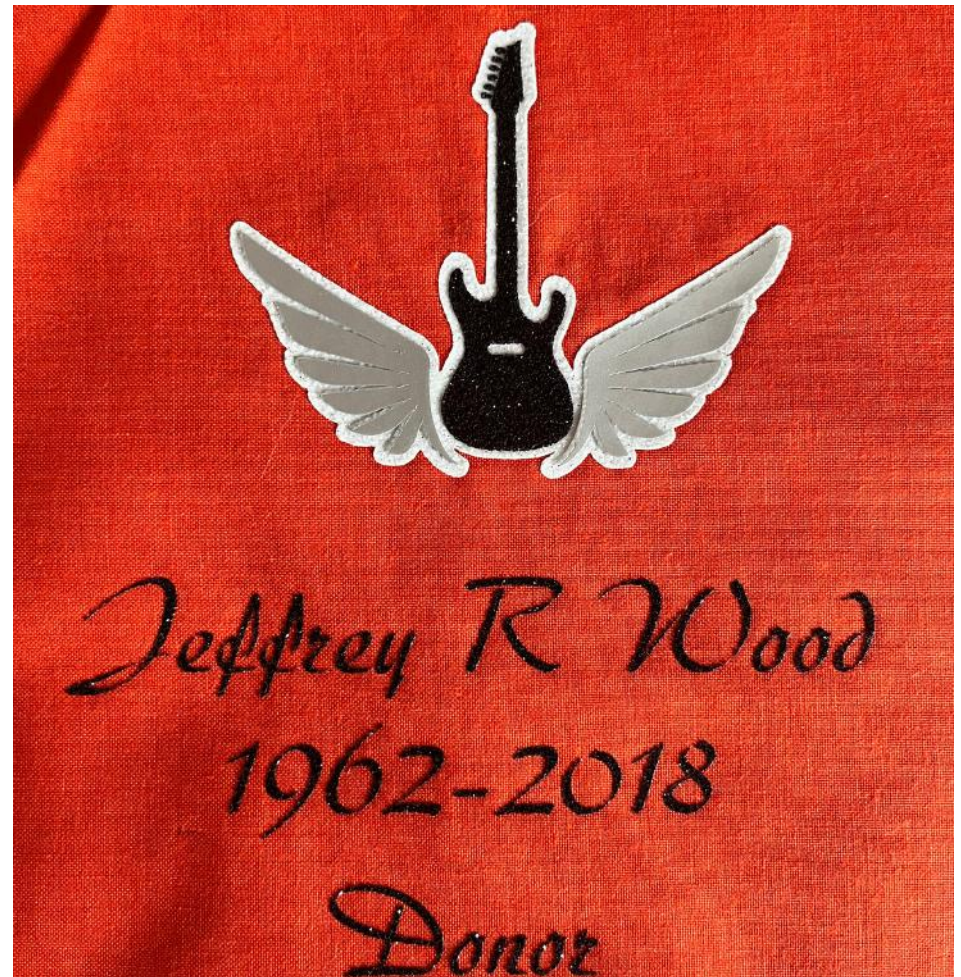
He was passionate about his business and had a strong work ethic that he passed on to his children, which made his family-run business his pride and joy.

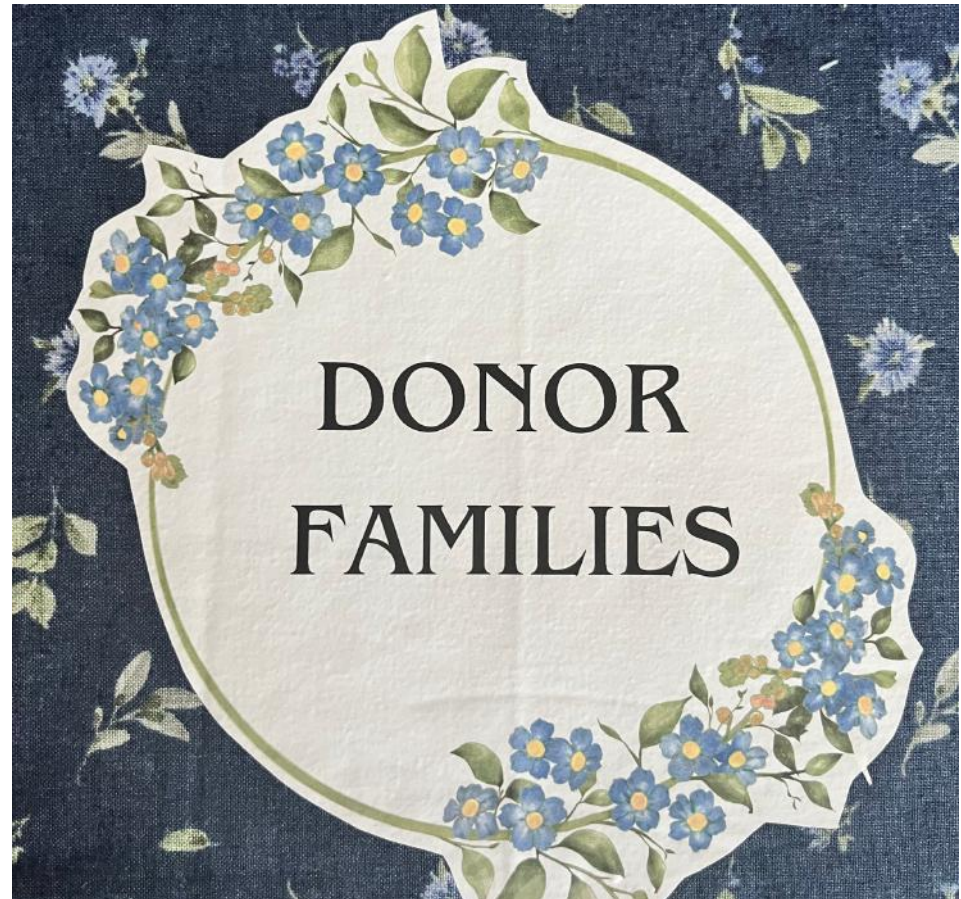

The Erase the Wait Program

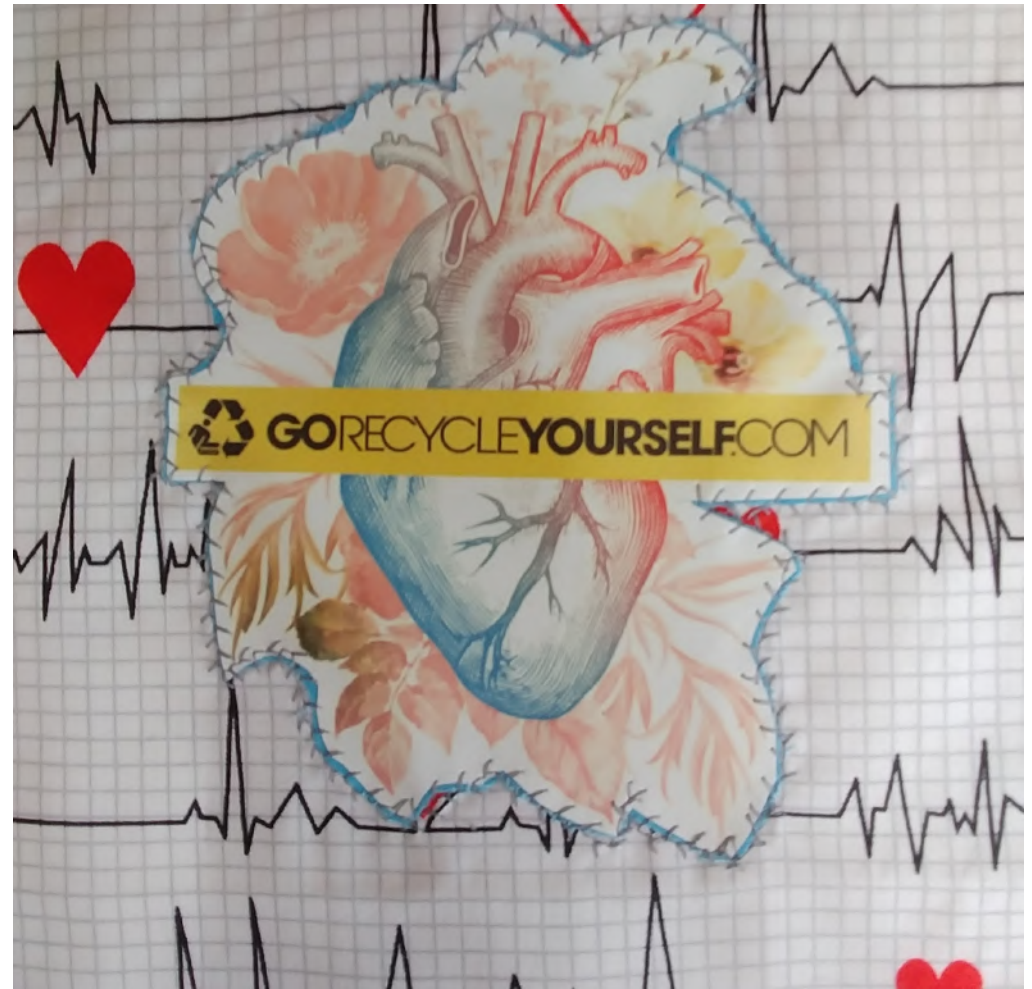

Through peer networking, education on living donation, training on sharing one's story and need, and the chance to speak with people who have experienced living donation, participants are equipped to pursue living donation in the way that is most suitable for them.

The Eliminemos la Espera Program focuses on educating kidney patients on kidney transplantation and living donation and pairing them with mentors. We want to support the Spanish-speaking community to empower themselves with education and resources.

Transplant Education for Dialysis Patients

focuses on giving patients the ability to explore the option of transplant and understand how it may be beneficial to them.

GoRecycleYourself is a campaign of Donate Life Northwest. Our goal is to debunk the common myths which prevent registration, provide a resource for those interested in learning the facts about donation, and build a community of donation supporters.

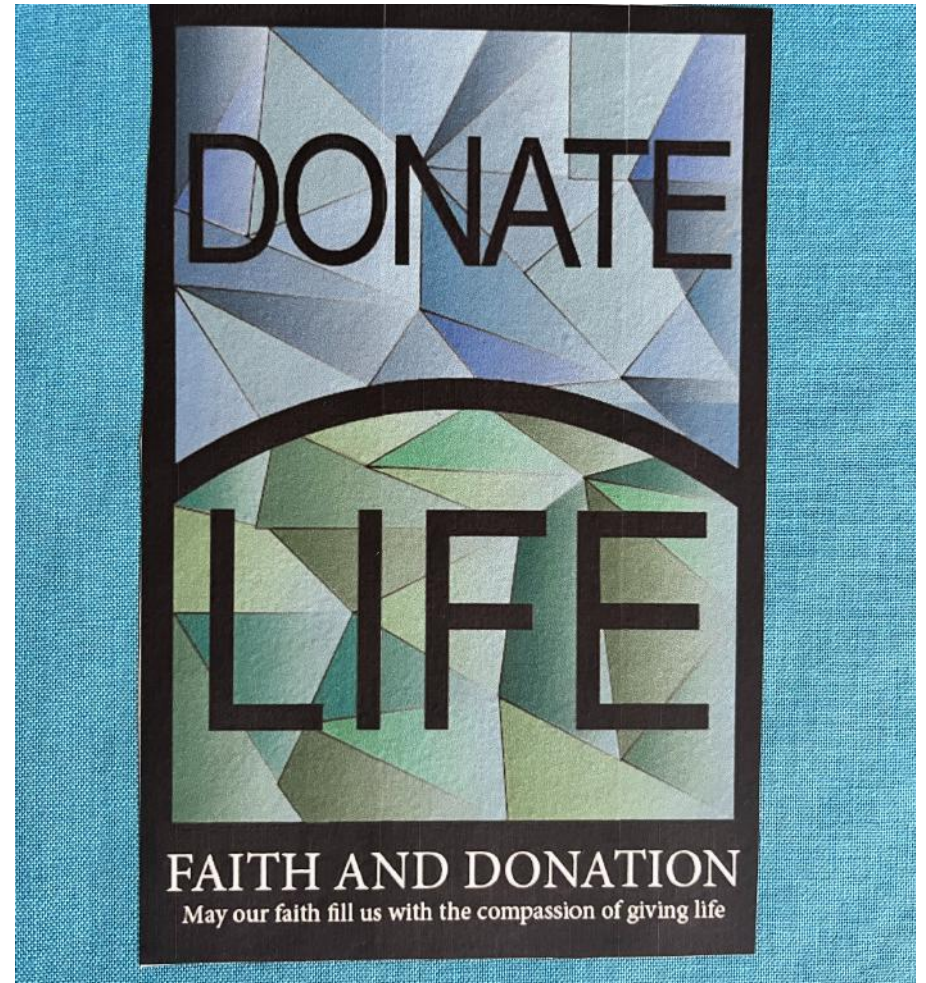

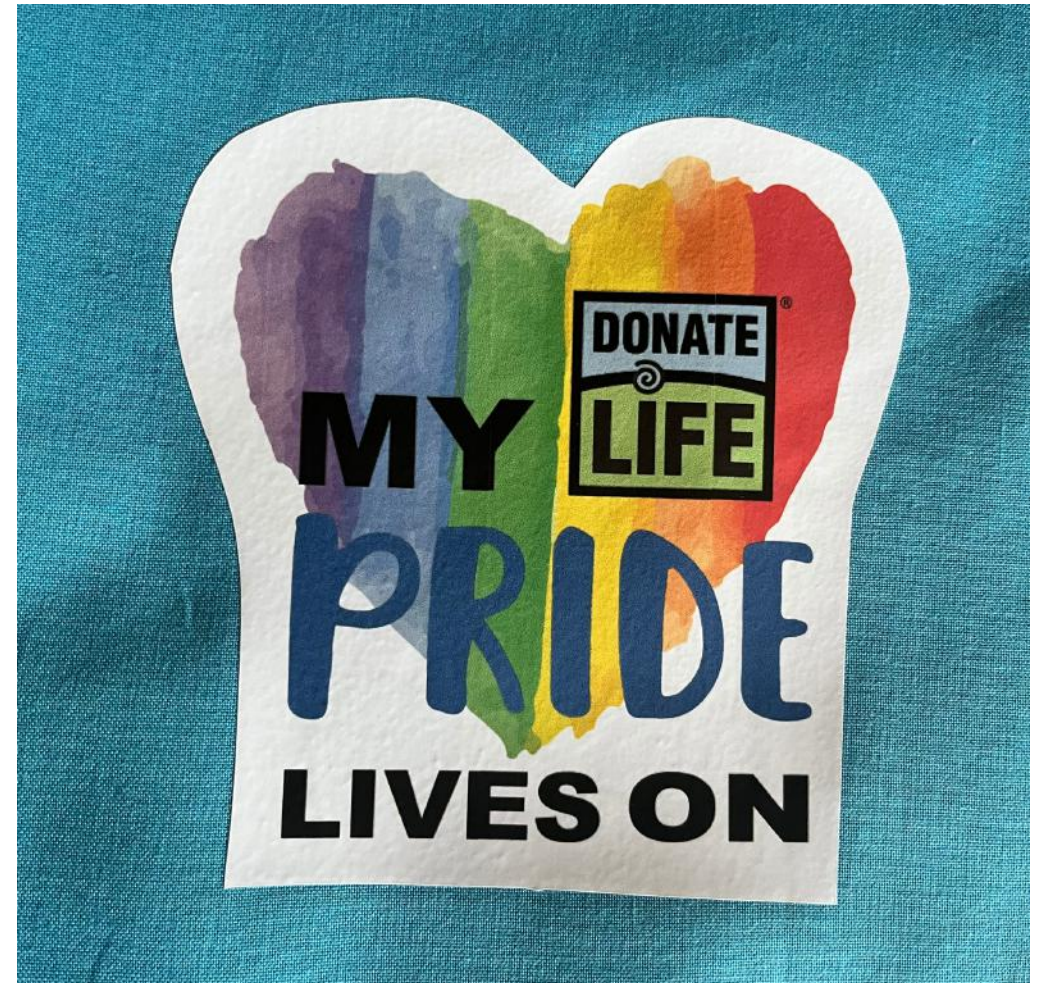
