


2022-2023 STUDENT SURVEY RESULTS

Q2: **AFTER** today's presentation, how much do you know about organ, eye, and tissue donation and the Donor Registry? (0-4; nothing-expert)


Q3: **AFTER** today's presentation, how do you feel about organ, eye, and tissue donation? (circle all that apply)




Before: Average knowledge score of 1.31 **After**: Average knowledge score of 3.27

Which applies to you?



- In the summer of 2022, Oregon reached 3 million registered organ donors!




 Oregon House Bill 3234 goes into effect in 2025 which requires high school health classes to cover the topic of organ and tissue donation and education.



School Request Process

- 1. Teachers request a presentation from Donate Life Northwest via an online form
- 2. Donate Life Northwest sends emails to trained Donate Life Educators for upcoming presentation opportunities
- 3. If interested and available, you can sign up online to do the presentations

In-person Presentations

- Receive materials in the mail or arrange an office pick up
- 5. Allow 30 minutes prior to first presentation to get to school, sign in at front office and find classroom
- 6. Give presentation(s)
- 7. Answer questions
- 8. Give, review and collect student evaluation
- 9. Thank teacher
- 10. Return surveys and any registration forms to DLNW

- 9. Thank teacher




