## Who we are:

Work-life balance and mutual support are essential to maintaining the energy and focus needed for our dynamic work. The Executive Director will quickly develop a solid understanding of the organ, eye and tissue donation process and become an advocate at the state and national level. As a strong nonprofit leader, the ED will assess program efficiency, collaborate in the building of programs, engage with the community and fundraising, and stay current in the dynamic environment of donation and transplant.

1. Become an expert in organ, eye, and tissue donation processes, especially as it relates to the importance of the public becoming registered donors.

- Actively develop relationships with philanthropic donors.
- Develop meaningful and long-term relationships with community partners and volunteers.
- Work collaboratively with staff and board to further embed diversity, equity, inclusion, and anti-racism within Donate Life NW's policies, practices, programs, and initiatives.

- Serve as the principal voice and face of the organization to supporters, the media, and the general public.
- Serve as the lead advocate for Donate Life Northwest with public officials, some of which include legislators and DMV staff.
- Represent Donate Life Northwest programs with knowledge and respect.
- Represent Donate Life Northwest in community-centered fundraising.
- Build relationships with and engage with a variety of diverse communities.
- Work to develop strategic and operational partnerships with other donor organizations both locally and nationally.
