

LIVING KIDNEY DONATION

What is Living Kidney Donation?

A procedure in which a living person donates a kidney to someone in need of transplant. On average, a kidney transplanted from a living donor lasts longer than one from a deceased donor.

Why is it needed?

Nationally, nearly 100,000 people are waiting for a kidney transplant. Oregon patients wait, on average, 5-7 years. In the meantime, they are dependent upon dialysis, which can decrease their overall health.

How do you get a transplant?

If your kidney function is below 20 percent you can undergo a series of exams to find the best match and ensure you are healthy enough for transplant. Once on the list, a patient may wait up to 10 years for a kidney from a deceased donor to become available. However, a living donor transplant can be scheduled within a year of finding a compatible match.

How do you find a living donor?

Living donors can be relatives, friends, or strangers. By sharing your story with as many people as possible, you are more likely to find a donor.

How do you find the best living donor match?

Paired exchange involves at least two pairs of living kidney donors and transplant candidates who are not the most compatible matches. The candidates then “swap” donors so that each candidate receives a kidney from the most compatible donor.

BECOME A LIVING DONOR

DIRECTED DONORS specify who they want to receive their kidney. They can be related or unrelated to their recipient.

NON-DIRECTED DONORS do not specify nor know their recipient.

BASIC DONOR REQUIREMENTS:

(dependent on transplant center)

- Be at least 21 years old
- Have a healthy BMI
- No history of diabetes, hypertension, cancer, kidney or heart disease


